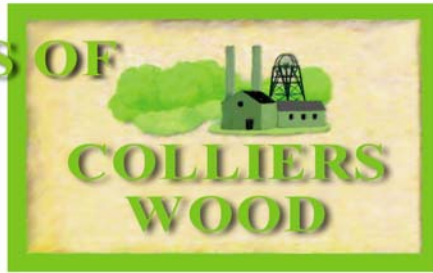

Part of Greenwood

Nottinghamshire's Community Forest

Colliers Wood is community woodland created on the site of the former Moorgreen Colliery, which forms part of the **Greenwood**, Nottinghamshire's community forest. The wood is designed to restore the type of mixed woodland and grazing meadows that existed before the mine was developed.

Open areas on the site are seeded with wild grasses and wild flowers. Hawthorn hedgerows enclose the site on several boundaries. Thousands of native trees have been planted in copse arrangement. Ponds were created to further extend the habitats for wildlife and fauna and a network of paths provides access to the various landscapes and picnic areas.

Friends of Colliers Wood are a group of local people interested in the woodland, acting as a link between the community who use the area and Broxtowe Borough Council who own and maintain the site. The group expressed the desire of many families to use part of the woodland for memorial purposes. Broxtowe agreed and the Friends now manage the scheme.

Memorial Planting Scheme

The nature of the woodland prohibits individual trees being identified for specific personal memorial. The named Waterloo Seam Memorial Copse has been established as the planting site. The Friends of Colliers Wood organise the supply and planting of the trees. You are welcomed to join us at the planting. Friends believe that the families involved will be able to identify with this copse as a robust, long lasting and significant memorial to their loved ones. Individual trees are not related to individual contributors. The plantings are mixed species sourced from local native stock. We can not supply a particular species for a particular planting.

A Book of Remembrance is maintained at Durban House and is available for inspection. The names of those for remembrance are entered along with a short epitaph.

The scheme consists of the calligraphy entries into the Book of Remembrance and provision of a small tree for planting. A fee of £25.00 is charged for participation in the scheme.

Annual plantings take place in either late autumn or early spring. The date for the planting will be subject to the site conditions and forecasted weather. We use a mixture of young bare-rooted dormant stock and pot grown specimens. The copse is a mixed native tree planting.

Holes will be prepared ready for a morning event. You and your family are welcomed to join us. Confirmation of start time and date will be made approximately two weeks before the planting.
