Colliers Wood is one of a growing number of forest parks within the Greenwood Community Forest.



Colliers Wood is a 12 hectare site on Engine Lane, close to the town of Eastwood. The site is managed carefully to ensure ongoing improvements in habitat diversity and to promote accessibility by the general public.

Colliers Wood offers an exciting variety of curriculum opportunities across the woodland, grassland and wetland habitats. There is an extensive network of footpaths over the whole site available for use by visitors. Visitors with limited mobility should be aware that the site has hilly terrain.

Please do not wander too far off the marked paths, as you may be walking into a sensitive wildlife area.

Colliers Wood is easily reached by road and public transport. The park is open to the public all year round. The site lies off Engine Lane at Moorgreen and is approximately one mile from Durban House Heritage Centre on Mansfield Road. If accessing the site from Durban House, please note there is a 2-metre height restriction barrier approximately half a mile from Durban House at the entrance to the Industrial Estate. There is a car park at Colliers Wood which has a 2-metre height restriction barrier. Contact Traveline on 0870 608 2608 for travel plans.



The History of Colliers Wood

Colliers Wood is a community woodland within the Greenwood Community Forest created on the former Moorgreen Colliery site. The wood has been designed to restore the landscape common to the area before the mine was developed.

Moorgreen Colliery was sunk by the Barber, Walker & Company in 1868 and was one of five pits owned by the family. Two shafts were sunk and coal production commenced in 1871, reached its peak in 1963 and was gradually decreased until closure in 1985.

Restoration of the site was undertaken during 1997/8 with extensive habitat creation for wildlife forming an integral part of the scheme.

The site is now enjoyed by the local community and supported by the Friends of Colliers Wood, who work with Broxtowe Borough Council to actively encourage and promote continued community involvement.

The area has great local historical value and has close links with the D. H. Lawrence Heritage at Durban House Heritage Centre in nearby Eastwood. Lawrence's father worked at Moorgreen's sister pit of Brinsley and Lawrence used local characters and events as a source for many of his books.

Parking

Car parking for organised groups is available, if booked in advance, at Durban House Heritage Centre and at Colliers Wood, Engine Lane.

Facilities available to schools

Durban House Heritage Centre, which is accessible by wheelchair, has a bistro and a meeting room that can be booked for group use. The D. H. Lawrence Birthplace Museum is also available for organised school visits. Tel: 01773 717353.



Toilet facilities

These are situated at Durban House Heritage Centre and include toilets accessible by wheelchair. Please inform the centre if you are bringing a school group and are intending to use the facilities.

Equipment and materials

When using the resource kit, please check the contents of the box on the checklist enclosed before use and report any missing items on returning to Durban House Heritage Centre.

For your visit you will need to provide:

- Clipboards
- Paper
- Pencils
- Erasers and pencil sharpener
- First Aid kit

All other equipment is provided for each activity. You may need to photocopy worksheets and make the pond dial in class before your visit.

Working at Colliers Wood

The map provided shows paths in the park and it is important that school groups stay on these, unless instructed to explore further, to avoid trampling through environmentally sensitive areas. The attached map indicates some of the different activity areas.

If working in the copse please arrange for this area to be accessible. There is also a key to open gates for wheelchair access.

Colliers Wood is a public site so please ensure children are aware of "stranger danger" procedures and how to behave when dogs are around.

There is also a wheelchair accessible auditorium capable of seating 50 children on site which can be used as an outdoor classroom.

Trailblazer

Many schools are now taking part in the Trailblazer scheme and a day at Colliers Wood is an excellent way of working towards credits and awards. Further details can be obtained from Nottinghamshire County Council and Nottingham City Council education departments. Schools are encouraged to work towards credits in all strands of the scheme. A day on site lends itself to the PLAN – DO – REVIEW model and children can be involved in all aspects of a visit. One idea for a children's review sheet is included in this section.
